




The Grotto

Portland Aerial Tram

Locally known as the "Silver Twinkie," the Tram is a five minute ride each way, rising 500 vertical feet and traveling 3300 feet in distance. The cabin will swing slightly at the tower (so first time riders are asvised to hold a rail). Views are spectacular, especially at sunset. <5 miles from the Water Tower





Pittock Mansion

Built in 1914, Pittock Mansion tells the story of Portland's transformation from pioneer town to modern, industrialized city through the history and legacy of Portland's newspaper mogul. There are Amazing views from the mansion, especially at sunset. <10 miles from the Water Tower

Shanghai Tunnels


This self-guided walking tour (durated by the Hotel Zags) will take you by a variety of interactive fountains.



One of the stops on the list – Keller Fountain Park (https://www.portland.gov/parks/keller-fountain-park) – became an internationally acclaimed open space after its 1970 completion. 13,000 gallons of water per minute cascade through its terraces and platforms, suggesting the Northwest's abundant waterfalls.
